The coach house and pool are surrounded by boxwood hedges, interspersed with a variety of colourful flowers. As you exit through the last gate, you are led through a small courtyard well camouflaged by a mixture of perennial plantings.

This one acre lot, first surveyed in the late 1700's by John Graves Simcoe, is a rare preservation of an historic space. The Regency/Georgian structure on the property was constructed circa 1817 by the Honorable William Claus, then Deputy Superintendent of Indian Affairs. The home has been in the possession of the Howe family since 1981. The property was extensively restored in 2014 with the goal to preserve the openness of the grounds and the large variety of mature trees, providing a canopy of shade and greenery. The grounds maintain privacy while not being overly complicated in design.

After designing and maintaining our residential gardens in Ottawa and Kingsville, we decided that small was definitely better. In 2013, with the expert assistance of David Galloway, we set about modifying this secluded garden, including a pond, urns, a heated octagonal garden house and whimsical ornaments, into a low maintenance autumn garden. There are many unique plants, such as a Chinese Seven Son Flowering bush, Sango Kaku (coral bark) and Shaina Japanese Maples, Weeping Katsura, Wavyleaf Copper Beech, Goldfinch Cut-leaf Elder.

A grand home and focal point of Niagara-on-the-Lake's Queen Street. The front garden is a fabulous display of colourful annuals set against the foundation plantings. The resort-like backyard has two levels, with a beautiful pool above and a volleyball court below, all set off by a large porch and extensive gardens. It is often used as a test garden for interesting specimens such as a variety of Japanese maples, weeping Atlas cedars, an evergreen magnolia and several beech varieties including a tricolor.

The McDougal-Harrison-Bedell house is a historic, two story Regency townhouse located on the main street of Niagara-on-the-Lake. The original structure was built by Adam Crysler circa 1820, and the brick and clapboard extension was added on to the house circa 1830-1840. Interesting mixtures of formal and casual perennial plantings are situated in various "rooms" on three-quarters of an acre and were planted to complement this heritage home. They provide a constant supply of cuttings for the many award winning floral designs this owner completes. This is a four seasons "gardener's garden".

This Dutch Colonial Revival Home built in 1915 has lovely ornamental gardens divided into four quadrants of a heart. These gardens are bursting with seasonal colours all year long and emit delightful scents and attract butterflies, bees and hummingbirds. The driveway intermingled with low growing chamomile is lined by raspberry hedges that flow over to vegetable plots on the adjacent side. The potager is designed with 10 distinct beds and includes perennial and annual herbs and vegetables. Poem plaques throughout the gardens add touches of whimsy and ambience.

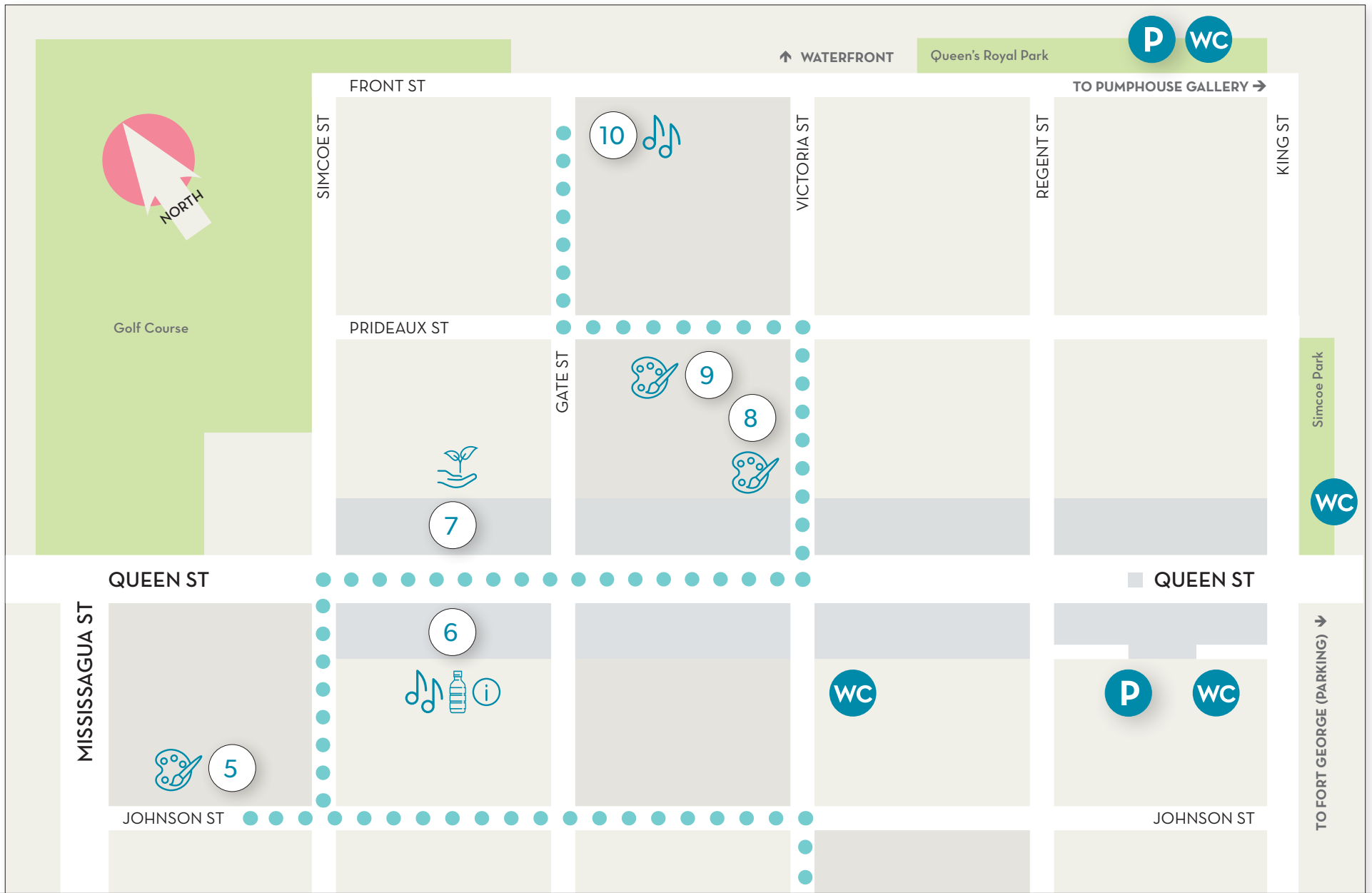

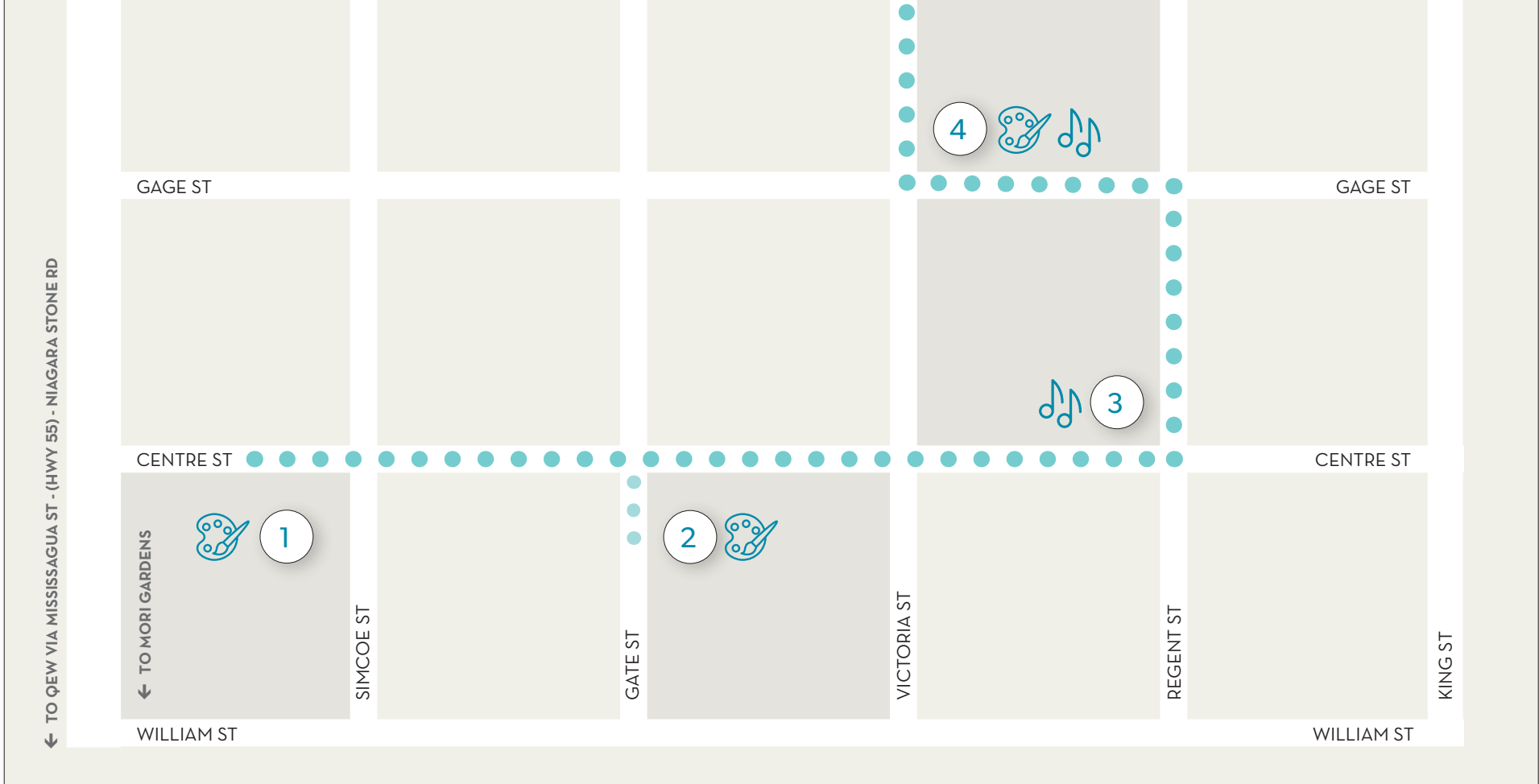

Unusual trees form the backdrop for this extensive collection of perennials and shrubs chosen for multi-season interest. Started 16 years ago, the plant-focused garden features four raised beds for tomatoes, herbs and cut flowers; dozens of seasonally planted containers; and a mulched path through a shady area with woodland plants. A path of reclaimed red bricks bisects the small front garden; a raised terrace and screened porch overlook the deep back garden. Clematis, daylilies, hellebores, hostas, hydrangeas, peonies and roses are particular favourites.
