115 Wellington St.

Music in garden

The original house was built circa 1850 with extensive sympathetic recent renovations. The house sits on half an acre of carefully manicured gardens. Both owners see this as a traditional Niagara garden. The north lawn boasts three magnificent chestnut trees and a border of yew hedges. It is written that the Confederate President, Jefferson Davies resided at this house. The south lawn rolls down to the pool area with decorative pear trees, boxwood hedges with lavender borders.

Carnochan House was built in 1883 and purchased by Janet Carnochan, noted historian and founder of the Niagara Historical Society. The front garden features colourful annuals and hostas accenting the yew hedge foundation plantings and ancient cedars. The hill garden at the back of the house is home to unusual perennials and a robust Eastern Red Bud tree and a Japanese Kerria. The back garden is accented with a Floyd Elzinga fire cone.

This beautiful garden was designed and planned to be a low maintenance green space surrounded by evergreens. Providing a space to relax and has plenty of open area for garden parties. Carefully positioned stepping stones lead your eye to the pergola at the back of the property, which is the focal point of the garden and echoes the architectural style of the main house. Perennials and flowering shrubs and colourful annuals complete the garden's peaceful ambiance.

This house was built in 1905 and retains much of its original character. The half-acre garden includes manicured Arbor Vitae hedges and climbing roses. The hydrangeas and hellebores have been planted over 15 years and continue to be augmented through propagation from existing stock. Recent changes include the replacement of the perennial borders around the main house and the addition of a number of mature trees. This is a working garden and always changing.

The owners began to develop these gardens in 2003. The hillside site, with a creek and wetland including wet and dry areas with sections that include heavy shade and bright sun. In 2008 with help from the Niagara Peninsula Conservation Authority they undertook the project of naturalization of the wetland. This involved sterilization and replanting the area with native species that now dominate the wetland and require minimal maintenance.

The front of the house is the home of a magnificent pink flowering magnolia tree, a magnet for birds and bees. The back yard blooming miniature apple tree, combined with the lilies and grasses in the pond, offers a shady haven for the fish. A Japanese red maple, cedar and silver spruce add colour and texture to this garden. The weeping willow provides shade for the ferns and holly bushes. Early summer brings blooms from peonies, lilies, irises along with yellow and white daisies.

The backyard is a lovely private hidden oasis with mature specimens, including a flowering dogwood, a tricolor beech and a butterfly bush.

This garden features an allée of ornamental pear, cherry and Canadian maples and is under planted with euonymous ground cover and features quince and dwarf Asian maples. The driveway is bordered by English columnar oaks, dwarf burgundy Asian maples, Hydrangeas, dogwoods, elder bushes and snow cone trees. Two sculptures accent this garden. In the back the lake view takes center stage, while a willow creates privacy; the shoreline slope features lilac, forsythia, mock orange, and ivy.

This Japanese inspired garden features an aged Camperdown elm, Japanese maples, dogwoods, hydrangeas, weeping copper beech, columnar oaks, a crabapple tree, and magnolias. The custom designed copper tube and cedar trellis is under planted with climbing wisteria and hydrangeas and lily of the valley. It serves as an outdoor painting space, a baffle and a contemplative tea space. Giant peonies, hostas, pachysandra, wood violets and cone flowers flourish in the shade.

The courtyard gardens contain large artifacts from the museum's collection including a dry sink, millstones, a hitching post and two large cauldrons. The two large stones that sit outside the fence were found on York Road and are believed to be from the old railway or carriage route. These stones would have served as steps off the train or carriages. Two beds of 1812 Roses adorn the garden along with hydrangeas and hostas. Boxwoods complete the garden along the white picket fence.
